

Here Comes the Sun

To say that interpreting Beatles top tunes through photographs is as engaging as listening to them is an understatement.

This is exactly how Tony Cancio, first place winner of this month's themed contest, felt when he found out that time wasn't on his side. With the deadline drawing near and no viable concept to work on, Tony thought of skipping the contest proper. Luckily for him, there was this sweet advice from good friend Udsie Villarica who urged him to sift through his files.

He then searched for a Beatles' song which he felt most attached to and started matching it to what he had on file.

As a landscape photographer, Tony has photographed various spectacular sunrises. From these, he chose an image that was anti-solar with the light reflecting on the mountains of Fitz Roy during the morning 'Alpenglow'.

An image with the sun still below the horizon spreading morning lights on the mountain peaks got his attention:

'That alpenglow had a light band that lit up the middle portion of the mountains of El Chalten. Viewing the image, one can readily hear the song 'Here Comes

the Sun' while imagining the sun slowly stretching its arms as the sun rises above the horizon, '

In comparison to the previous themes, Tony found the Beatles theme definitely more challenging than the usual single concept themes the club has had in the past. It afforded the photographer a slew of songs with even more lyrics to interpret and many, in more abstract ways. He thinks it was an inspired choice by the board and he's certain it made everybody stretch their imaginations to come up with contest worthy photos.

Like Tony, Jijo de Guzman's entry which won second best (a photo of a man buttonholed by pigeons), came from his treasure trove. It was taken in Osaka during the club's on-the-spot contest in Japan in 2014.

He took out one of his fave photos and put the two together without much deliberation. He believes that the adherence to the theme and the visual impact were the key components that appealed to the judges

When asked as to what he can attribute his constant monthly winning streak of he said: "We have a lot of very talented photographers in the club who are capable of producing stunning photos. I just do my best in choosing beautiful photos that match the theme perfectly. I also make sure that my entries are technically sound and have strong visual appeal and impact."

While My Guitar Gently Weeps

The photo which won the judges nod for 3rd place is Jake Lagonera's "While My Guitar Gently Weeps". Also drawn from his files, it is an image which was candidly captured in the streets of Cambridge, England two years ago.

He had wanted to crop the lady on the right but decided against it. It dawned on him that the angle was more dramatic. How he had wished though that the woman was walking away rather than going toward the guitar player. He looked for stock shots he has of people playing the guitar. He found three, but decided on this one because it had the feel of the song. He likes the bright yellow color of the wall and found the lighting good. He also felt that the presence of the lady in the photo totally enhanced the image.

He found this month's theme "harder to handle" this time, because it is difficult to match a photo with a song title. He says, it was interesting, though. He suggests to make it simpler next time, one song title instead of 10! But then again, the photos submitted would all be similar with no variety.

He believes that he was just lucky to have captured and frozen the drama of a guitar performer with a woman on the other side of the wall. The image is as intense as the photographer's search for the golden moment. – **Rene Paraan**

OTS TOP PHOTOGRAPHERS FOR JULY 2016

Manny Gaite, the lawyer who ranked No. 1 rank in our On-the Spot (OTS) Top Photographer competition in July 2016 in Marikina, used to be from the shoe capital of the Philippines when he was studying in ADMU. He knew the city like the palm of his hand. When the contest started, he knew where to go and who to see to get great photos.

He claimed to have started early, around six o'clock in the morning. Knowing where to find possible subject for his OTS, he went straight to the residence of his friend artist, Lydia Velasco. Surprisingly, when Manny arrived, she was working on her mural-size painting. So, not wanting to waste time, he looked for the best angle and clicked away. Voila! There goes his winning photo.

During the OTS, Manny was in hurry to take his photos. He had to bring his son to the hospital that day. He went straight to one of the Marikina icons - the Shoe Museum. When he arrived, he saw kids playing outside the museum. He invited them to get inside and posed for a picture beside a decor that looked like a tree of hanging shoes. When he felt he already got his right composition, he pressed his shutter and submitted this entry which garnered high score from the judges.

Manny used his ever-dependable Sony RX 100 series with 28 mm lens to capture his winning photos. He has been in photography for 30 years.

Our second **winner** for the OTS Top Photographer is another lawyer, Manolo **Roxas**. Unlike Manny, he is not from Marikina and thus he is not familiar with the location. However, to get his photos, he asked few resident friends of Marikina to give him some suggestions where to go.

On the day of the shoot, Manolo, like Manny, went early morning in the shoe city. He made sure that he was in the area during the golden hour or sunrise - time of day where source of light is soft and more flattering for the subject.

Manolo, like a pro photographer, went discreet and inognito during his shoot. He did not want to alarm or scare people. He wanted to take photos of people doing their daily chores. As his strategy, he did not bring his DSLR. He brought his ala-point and shoot camera, Leica M (240) rangefinder with ultra-wide 35 mm lens.

Manolo started young in photography. His said his father was his first mentor in taking great photos. He always borrowed his Dad's Zeiss Contarex 35mm rangefinder. In 1975, he bought his own camera - Nikon F2 Photomic with several lenses. He also had a chance to learn how to develop and print photos. He loves to take pictures of people, landscape, wild life and travel photography.

Our **third winner** for the OTS Top Photographer is not a lawyer but a CPA cum Businessman, Chito **Vinas**. Prior to the day of the shoot, he was already mulling about the theme "human interest." His plan was to take photo of residents of Marikina especially workers doing their day-to-day routine.

Chito believed that he had to come up with a unique photo different from what other CCP members would shoot. So, when he had a chance, he looked for a ladder, though a bit shaky, he climbed it and took a top view shot of his subject. A shot that gave him high score in this OTS. He used his Leica M240 with a 50mm f/ 1.1 Voigtlander Nokton, ISO 640 at shutter speed 1/90.

Chito was in grade school when he got his camera - a 110 film format, Diana camera. He transitioned from one camera to another until he became the official photographer of the family. In all his family events or gatherings, he was there with his camera. He likes street and landscape photography.

OTS TOP PHOTOS FOR JULY 2016

The winner of the OTS top photo is businessman, **Jijo De Guzman**. He currently enjoys shooting action and sports, landscape and travel photography.

During OTS in Marikina, Jijo brought a camera and lens which he is most comfortable with: his Canon 1Dx and 24mm f1.4L prime lens. He mentioned he did not even bring a spare body and lens on that day. That's how confident he is with his gear.

When asked for the so called "formula" for his images, **Jijo** said that if you are joining any competition like OTS there are no hard-and-fast rule to follow in order for you to win the competition because locations, conditions and elements vary. He said you just have to do your best to come up with beautiful photos and always try to present an "ordinary scene extraordinary well."

Jijo's winning photo was a worker in a shoe factory carrying sheets of leather. When he noticed that the ambient light was favorable, he did few test shots until finally he got the shot he wanted.

Like other members of CCP, he started as the official photographer of the family. He was always sought after if there were family parties.

Javi Flores, a lawyer who ranked No. 2 in our OTS Photo competition. He grew up in Marikina and played along its narrow alleyways long before the legendary BF Fernando turned it around. He had this idea that since he knew the place so well he would have an easier time during the OTS. He was mistaken. He said that street photography was not really his cup of tea. In fact, he had difficult time coping with the contest theme, "human interest."

Javi, is a Conceptual Photographer. However, he said that he is now paying more attention to light and how it behaves. He planned to teach how to paint with light one of these days.

Javi, for his OTS entry, started shooting on Sunday morning. However, in spite of all the photos he had taken, he seemed not satisfied with them. Thus, feeling frustrated, he went to the famous Rustic Mornings restaurant for breakfast. While there, he met CCP Master Bien Bautista who gave him a profound advice on photography: *the only way to overcome your difficulties in photography is to keep doing what you do not like doing*. Keeping that in mind, he went out that night again to give it one last try. But it rained hard. When it stopped, he accidentally saw a puddle of rain water illuminating the Cross of the church. He did not waste time and clicked away. Voila! This is his winning entry.

The rose among the thorns of winners is a fine lady, **Annabelle Chavez**. She got the 3rd spot in our OTS Top Photo competition. She said she was already imagining the theme, "human interest" even before the contest date. When she went out to take photos, she looked for interesting people doing something in their environment. Compared with other winners, **Annabelle**, took a long time to come up with her winning entry. She said she consumed about 16gb or around 250 shots with her reliable Nikon D610 with 24mm at f2.8 focal length. I guess her perseverance and tenacity paid off. She ranked 3rd in our OTS contest.

Annabelle got into photography by accident. She broke her wrist while dancing. The doctor who attended to her was a CCP member and serious photography hobbyist, Dr. Lito Gozum.
