



Last July's theme, Environmental Predicament / Climate Change, drew a wide variety of subjects and interesting interpretations from our members. Leo Riingen, Adel Samson, and Jan Aliling took the top three spots with their winning entries of a power plant at sunrise, ice along the beach, and a blazing fire in the city.

Leo won top photo for the month with his entry shot during last year's Bataan OTS. He was trying to catch the sunrise but instead noticed a power plant in the foreground of the rising sun. He was struck by the different smoke formations against the glowing sky. Leo says his entry depicted the "contrast of our light source produced either by the natural sun or the power plant. The drama of the sun struggling past the morning clouds and the smoke is like the dilemma that we face as we become conscious of our environment." This win for Leo definitely deserves a jump shot!

The beauty of Dumaguete Bay and the tragedy of environmental abuse are both depicted in Adel Samson's entry which the judges deemed the second best photo among 80 plus entries for July. Doc Adel, as he is sometimes fondly called in the Club, explains that the algae in his photo is usually caused by an imbalance of coliform units of bacteria from human waste in the ocean environment. "It makes for a good photograph

but it is also a bad signal for the ecosystem," he adds. Adel says he had to be sure it wasn't high tide when he came back for the shot at the time of sunset and sunrise. "I was lucky with that one," he said. Adel mainly uses Lightroom's basic global adjustments to enhance what's in the photo and bring out the emotion he had when he took the shot. "If I am able to convey that, then that makes for a successful photo," he adds.

On third place is Jan Aliling's image of a fire he shot from his window entitled "Dragon's Breath." The fire broke in a dense neighborhood near Nueve de Febrero in Mandaluyong. Jan says he usually does not like shooting negative subjects so he had very little stock photos for last month's theme. Then he remembered this long exposure shot he took that may very well fit the theme. And fit it did!

As Quincy thoughtfully suggested on Facebook, it will be a great idea for the Camera Club of the Philippines to mount a photo exhibit not just in

print, but in the CCP website "to draw more awareness to this very real situation that needs to be addressed."

30 beautiful candidates vying for the crown with the purpose of promoting Tourism, Social Responsibility and Fashion all of whom who





Lifetime Member **ERNIE FAJARDO**

It was a rainy afternoon at 2pm over a cup of coffee at UCC when I met with one of our dapper lifetime members Ernie Fajardo. He has been a member of the Club for forty years. Please note, FORTY BIG YEARS! He joined in 1977 and was sponsored by Rosauro "Chit" Inciong.

"Ernie" as we fondly call him, was an Economics graduate of the Ateneo De Manila University and currently the President of Liberty Commodities Inc. - part of the Liberty group of companies involved in a wide range of enterprises including flour milling, food processing and marketing, animal feed production, agribusiness, chemicals, food service and real estate. He became President of the Club in 1984 and served as Director from 1979-81 and 1988.

A photography enthusiast ever since - he started out using a Pentax Spotmatic film camera shooting family parties and events. He said he was one of the members in the Club who shifted last from film camera to digital. He only realized it when members of the Club were invited by member Kevin Tan to shoot in Eastwood Mall in Libis, Quezon City. They were there in the afternoon and it was drizzling. The light was a bit dark and gloomy. When they saw the photos and compared notes, those who made use of the digital cameras had tack sharp and awesome photos. However, in his case, he saw a lot of grain in his pictures. Frustrated, he decided to transfer from film to digital. He accumulated several digital Canon cameras plus its wide array of lenses and became part of what they call "Canon Boys" of the Club. However, when Canon EOS was launched in the market, all of the lenses he previously bought suddenly became obsolete and unserviceable. Out of spite, he switched to a Nikon digital camera.

Ernie's fondest memories of the Club



are:

During the 80s, he was in a group with another lifetime member Jaime Zobel de Ayala (JAZA for brevity) in Ermita, Manila for the On-the Spot contest. They went inside the night clubs and bars and started taking photos of girls on stage wearing skimpy tiny bikini. They walked thru the whole stretched of Mabini until they reached Gaiety Theater. While there, JAZA saw some photos of stage performers at the main entrance and while intently going over them, he was approached by a burly security of the theater who greeted him with a smile, "Good evening, Ambassador." JAZA was petrified and felt embarrassed. He ran off in haste to our side to hide. He was not expecting

anybody to recognize him. We all laughed when we saw his reaction.

Another funny moment was when the Club invited a topless model to pose for the members at the Skytop of Intercon Hotel. They brought out the model out in the veranda overlooking the beautiful city neon lights. Then later on, they noticed from afar, a huge fire somewhere in Pasay City which somehow served as the background of the model. Many of the members were stunned

because the scenario is reminiscent of the great fire in Rome which led to the downfall of Emperor Nero. He just fiddled while Rome was burning. After that incident, they heard that one of the wives complained about the model they invited. It became an issue in the Club for a while until someone suggested to

the then Board of Directors that wives should not be invited anymore to Club meetings which was immediately approved by the Club officers. Just a joke and wishful thinking of all the male members!

Ernie is happy with what is happening with the Club. He hopes that the Club will continually maintain its relevance in the community thru events and activities that shall form part of the Club's social obligation to our society.

In spite of the heavy downpour, I had a great time meeting with Ernie that afternoon. I thought he was a stern, serious-looking gent of the Club and felt a bit nervous prior to meeting him. I was mistaken. He was soft-spoken, smart and funny.
