I joined the Camera Club of the Phil. because of my mentors influence: **Pancho Escaler, Bien Bautista And Emil Davocol**. I started my career in photography as an assistant photographer in **Chroma Studios** owned and created by CCP members and now Lifetime members **Pancho, Emil,**

Bien, the late Ed Sarte and the late Waldy Cruz.


When I put up my own studio and advertising photography firm in **1990**, the competitive advertising industry required very high standards in photography. You must be technically advanced, skilled, flexible, experienced and, most of all, have a great portfolio. For the first 2 years, I struggled with having little experience and resources. I began thinking that the Camera Club of the Philippines was the only way to gain experience, to learn more and to practice better photography.

I joined The Club in 1992 and, in the years hence, it was The Club that really helped me in my career in photography. I became a multi-awarded Master photographer in The Club, won multiple awards locally and internationally in the advertising industry. I became one of the premier lensmen in the Philippines in the specialized field of advertising.

It was The Club's monthly competitions that helped build the best of my portfolio. It improved my skills and practice and honed in the intricate use of lighting as well as how to develop a good concept for entries, a technique I learned to practice well. This was essential in winning contests with various challenging themes. I did a lot of experimenting in my monthly entries in my studio, like making what I call impossible shots, with difficult so called "set-up photography". I try to go beyond this, not only for competitions but to satisfy my artistic cravings. The OTSes, on the other hand, helped me to shoot landscapes, to identify a good subject, to develop my composition techniques, to be flexible on all situations of lighting or weather.

I learned a lot in this Camera Club but not only photography. Most importantly, I made my best friends here. For The Club is like family that you will treasure for life. The camaraderie, the out of town and travel experiences with the members and our family members is what I treasure the most.

What I miss in the Club are the yearly performances of the members in groups with their wives and children. We must continue to involve our families in the Club because we need to show our children not only what we do in it but why we are so close, like a family. We have to think of the next generations of The Club.

A key milestone that we wish to achieve in the coming year is a definitive agreement towards the establishment of an **Institute or Center of Photography**, together with the infrastructure that goes with it, in cooperation with the University of the Philippines' College of Fine Arts. This effort has been shepherded by incoming director **Mark Victor Bautista**, who is not only a renowned Industrial Designer but also a well-respected University professor. His close relationship with the dean and professors of the UP College of Fine Arts provided us a head start and definitely a better chance to reaching a mutually agreeable arrangement in our involvement in the envisioned Institute of Photography that the state university is intent in putting up as early as next year. This involves the attendant construction of a building within the university premises that can conceivably house CCP's exhibit hall, small and large conference rooms, and its administrative office, among others. We have also recently met with the President of the UP together with the dean and professors of the College of Fine Arts and this idea has already been broached and they have shown keen openness to our vision.

We will continue to make our Master Cup competition more challenging, interesting and hopefully fulfilling for all. There will be some changes or more variety in our format in both the

monthly theme and OTS contests. For next year, we are introducing, or perhaps better to say, re-introducing the film slide format in one special theme contest (and possibly in one OTS). We will also have the projected format, meaning not printed but projected on TV and screen, like what we do for our OTS, for a number of monthly contests. We're hoping these will add variety and some leveling of the playing field, rounding out of the photography skills, for the entrants. We're quite fortunate that **Mang Rudy de Leon**, a Lifetime member, a 6-time Master Photographer, and a previous Contest Chair, has accepted the role of Chairman of the 2019 Contest Committee. Mang Rudy has been deeply involved in the changes and improvement in next year's contest. He will shortly issue, through our regular communication channels—the CCP Yahoo and Viber groups and the CCP website—the schedule of the themes, OTS, finals and the 2019 Contest Rules.

The Membership Committee, under the capable watch of Lifetime member **Joey Montalban**, will shortly release a member's packet that will contain information relevant to us as members. Such things as our membership rules, our Code of Conduct, our corporate documents, to name a few. Joey will ensure that members are constantly informed of the guidelines, policies and processes that pertain to maintaining their good standing in the Club.

A very critical task that we need to perform effectively is the management of our Club's financial resources. As has been intimated by President PSP, our Club's coffers require a boost, for us to sustain the momentum that was started from the time of previous boards. As some of you may be aware, one of the drains in our financial resources is the subsidy we provide for our monthly meeting dinner. In addition to the minimum order, we also have to pay for the use of the dining and tabulation rooms, which is not insignificant. Hence, we have considered assessing all regular and **probee members** the dinner fees for the entire year and making that part of the annual and semestral fees to be paid. We believe this will be equitable and fair to all those who religiously attend all the meetings. Moreover, we have considered moving the venue of our monthly meetings from Rockwell to The **Top of the Citi**. The latter does not charge for the use of the dining area, which is spacious enough to accommodate us. This is aside from having quite a nice night sky view. Past president **Fred Yuson** has already generously made the arrangements so that our January monthly meeting can be held there. There are adequate parking facilities near and around the building. We shall likewise make it a policy to report on the financial condition of the Club every month, either during the monthly meeting or by publishing the report in the appropriate Club's communication channels. Our Treasurer, **Chito Viñas** will make sure of that.

We shall likewise pursue the establishment of the **CCP Foundation**. Incoming director **Armand Apuya** will take on the cudgels of making that a reality by 2019. The foundation is envisaged to be our social responsibility arm. We wish to call on and solicit the participation of members who have the experience and the inclination towards social responsibility activities. This may include fund raising, identifying worthy causes, and the like. Please do not hesitate to approach Armand about your desire to help out.

Finally and to me the most important of all, we will endeavor to strengthen the camaraderie in the Club, which over time, has somewhat weakened by many factors, including the fact that we've grown so much as an organization. For us to achieve this goal, we would have to provide the venue, the situation and occasion for members to become better acquainted with and appreciate each other. While it is not our expectation that all members will achieve total and complete accord with everyone else, we will surely attempt at it. I'm sure we all want harmony in our beloved Club. We need everyone's help to achieve it.
