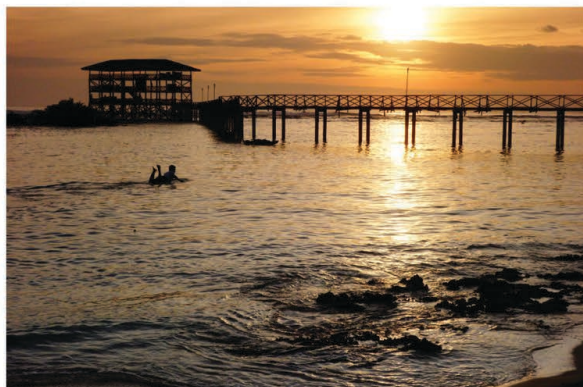


OTS: Siargao: "The OTS King Returns!"

The Best OTS photos chosen from the accumulated best of 5 OTSes of the year belong to **Manny Gaite, Evan Gabrador and Rudy de Leon** consecutively. The Best OTS Photographers of the Year are composed of **Raffy Santos, Armand Apuya and Manny Gaite**. There were a total of 49 members who joined at least one or more OTS destinations this year. The viewing of the best of all the OTSes in one go delighted the judges and viewers and we all wished we invited representatives of the Department of tourism to show them what we could do over a prescribed time and location. Maybe next time, we should.

We had **8 judges** for the 2 final competitions which involved over **240 entries** because this included an annual competition. **Jun Montifar**, an advertising photographer and impressionist painter is also **Raul Montifar's brother**. **Jam Ramos** teaches at I-Academy as photographer and multi-media arts and is a **TOP GEAR Phil.** photographer. **Betty Lalana** is the administrator of the Ortigas Foundation and has done a coffee table book documenting heritage churches of the Phil. **Doi Rosete** is a former dean of the college of Fine Arts of UP. **Redemtor Bitantes** is a renowned and multi-awarded furniture designer and teaches at the UP Fine Arts. **Architects Norman Garden and Rolly Mercado** have master planned several new developments country wide including the Davao Global Township. **Eames Demetrios** is the steward of the design legacy of American artists *Charles and Ray Eames*.

CCP ANALYTICS: THE YEAR IN NUMBERS"

It's a time to crunch the numbers. What do the numbers reveal? What made the difference? Aside from the big demand in participating monthly comes some highlights and tips on how to make your participation count.

66 members competed in the **Master Cup (MC)**. Finally, in the end, **Boyet Mesuga led Raffy Santos by 1.3774 points** with best OTS scores included. Raffy could not have overtook Boyet even if there were bonus points for the Best of Annual competitions which would have issued 0.600 points, 0.300 points, and 0.150 points each for the 1st, 2nd and 3rd placers for each of the Annual competitions.

On the other hand, **Raffy (2nd) led Manette Benitez (3rd) by a whopping 2.9802 points and Manette led Evan (4th) by 0.9920 points.**

In comparing the 3 Conferences (composed of grouping the total of 9 competitions into 3 consecutive groupings or so-called Conferences), once can see how hard a contender worked to win or gain placement in the MC. The top 3 in the **1st Conference were led by Bob Sison, Boyet Mesuga and Tony Lilles.** By the 2nd Conference, Boyet continued on his consistent lead while **Chito Viñas** climbed from 50th ranking of 61 participants in the 1st conference to become 2nd Place in the 2nd Conference. **Jun Garrido** became 3rd by climbing from 18th place.

Raffy on the other hand was ranked 10/61 in the 1st Conference, 15/53 in the 2nd Conference, and caught up as 3rd/41 in the 3rd Conference!

"The OTS Scores: Why OTS participation and Scores earned can make the difference...in the Master's Cup (MC)"

If you count all 5 OTSes in (that's 4 OTS+1 bonus), only **Raffy and Armand** managed to religiously attend each of the 5 OTS destinations. But since only 4 OTSes are really counted, 5 members managed the 100% OTS Qualifier Distinction which includes **Manny, Rey and Patrick.** Only 39 of our over 100 members attended at least 1 of the 4+1 OTSes.

The biggest difference for any participant to make from the highest combined score from 2 OTSes goes to **Manette Benitez.** who climbed to 3rd place in the MC from 5th place with her highest 4 OTS entry scores added. Others whose OTS scores also boosted them to the top 10 are **Jaime Cumagun, Gino Garbansos, Bob Sison and Tony Lilles.**

Raffy also got a boost for consistently and persistently trying to upgrade his OTS scores to reach the top, or more likely, to maintain his 2nd place MC standing. Note that **Boyet** ranks 9th to Raffy's 1st place in the OTS full-year standings.

Boyet's OTS scores remained average in all 3 of his 5 OTS participation but his consistent high scores in the monthlies ensured his lead.

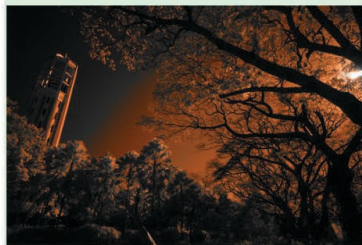
It was unusual that there were some failed entries during some OTS competition judging. This affects your score dramatically especially if

you participated in only 2 OTSes. This affected 7 participants in their final MC standing. Having 1 failed entry among your only 2 OTSes means the cumulative score will drop significantly vs. those with scores for 4 passing entries. Chances for climbing up rise when the highest scoring entries from several of your attended OTSes are automatically chosen. So if you want to participate in the MC competitions, the minimum rule is to attend and pass both entries in 2 OTSes. If you can only make time to enter 2 OTSes, join the early ones right away. If you fail in one, you have to join another to make up for a failed entry. There will be no leeway anymore if the 2nd OTS you attend is the last for the year and we get tough judges that give failing marks.

2020 will only have the standard 4 OTSes. This means you should attend at least the first 2 and have 2 OTS back-ups to complete 4 OTS entries or to better your existing OTS scores for the MC. Again, don't wait and miss an OTS opportunity because you may run out of OTSes to make up for a failed entry or a low score.

An example of this is **Jun Garrido (8th)** or **Leo Riingen (6th)**, who dropped down the MC due to only 1 attendance each in the OTS competitions. In the case of **Joey Antonio (11th)** who joined 2 OTSes but had a failed entry in one of them and could have had another chance but was not able to attend the last bonus OTS in Siargao to better complete at least 4 scoring OTSes. **Emir Bautista (18th)** also fell to 32nd in the MC due to a failed OTS entry.

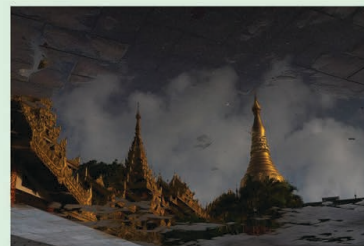

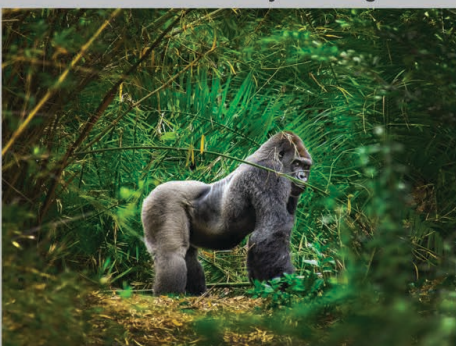
