In its first unprecedented furlough since World War II, the Camera Club of the Philippines held its inaugural, purely digital, on-line competition in June 2020. Contest Chairman Raffy Santos: "The question to proceed or not to proceed with the competition has been going around for the longest 45 days of our lives. It has been decided that the show must go on. The new normal seeks new approaches to our daily lives. At the same time, we need to protect, respect and keep the original spirit of the Mastercup competition."


The President together with the Board of Trustees have decided to make a memorial tribute for this year's contest. The 2020 competitions will be for the **Roberto Paterno Memorial Cup**, in honor of one of our Club's foremost vanguards. Naming the competition after Bobby, one of our most revered and dedicated members, stalwart and avid Club historian, is the simplest form of appreciation we can give to his years of unparalleled dedication to the CCP. It will be an honor for any member to be the winner of this Cup.

To start off this landmark competition, "Geometric" is one of our more challenging themes that delves into the abstract realm or aspect of our art. By definition, it is an adjective characterized by or decorated with regular lines or shapes. But Geometry concerns not only shape, but size, relative position of figures, and the properties of space. Entries varied from close-up macro to the ultra wide, from modern abstract to the natural world.

For our inaugural digital competition judge, Canon Crusader and landscape photographer **Edwin Martinez (Judge #2)**, found correlating all these to landscape especially challenging. He admits, after judging in three other Clubs in this new "on-line judging medium" during the weeks of lockdown, he found "judging our competition the most difficult". "It is different and a lot more challenging than eyeing" our usual prints on a table. Geometrics in landscapes needs a keen eye. It can be in the wide complexities of wild shapes, textures, layers and natural patterns. He searched for one with the biggest impact in terms of visual aesthetics and total visual design and color. Judge #4 was Architect Jojo Tolentino.

We invite all members to join this new medium for our artistic outlet and release. Art, especially photographic art, is our therapy in these trying times. Let us continue to practice, hone our skills and enjoy our art with our fellow enthusiasts amidst the New Normal and attend the announced Zoom meetings every month. As Raffy said: This will remind us that the Camera Club of the Philippines was started and will remain to be a social Club, especially in the years leading to our 100th."


1. Boyet Mesuga: In his own words:

In his own words:

Aside from the judging criteria requirements I was looking for photographs that were shot in angles that helped made the geometric beauty come out in a way that is not commonly seen.

Finding a beautiful and eye catching subject is one thing but capturing it in an angle that makes it feel more unique and interesting is a skill that I look for.

I was also looking at the basics from proper exposure, choice of blocking and creative use of depth.

The technique and of saturation to compliment the subject's color scheme also was a factor I was looking.

Overall it was a great and interesting experience judging the members' entries.

While judging the many pieces I tried to imagine how the photographer captured the image.

Some were set up and purposely composed. Some were scenes or objects just found in its natural perfect form and settings, waiting to be captured, photographed and immortalized.
